## POLICY UPDATES

**Biden Package Passes Senate; Health Center Provisions Remain Untouched**

The Senate passed [President Biden's \\$1.9 trillion COVID relief plan](#) on Saturday, after an all-night "vote-a-rama." The vote was 50 to 49 on a party-line vote. The House is expected to vote Tuesday on the bill to approve changes made in the Senate, none of which involved House-passed funding for health centers, LALs, National Health Service Corps, Nurse Corps or the Teaching Health Center Graduate Medical Education programs. Democratic leaders hope to have the bill on the President's desk by Friday, March 12, two days ahead of the expiration of unemployment benefits for 14 million individuals.

**Xavier Becerra's Nomination to be HHS Secretary Facing More Delays**

The Senate Finance Committee is still waiting to move out of committee the nomination of Xavier Becerra as Health and Human Services secretary. Senate Majority Leader Schumer may have to bring the nomination up for a full Senate vote under a "motion to discharge" as the committee remains deadlocked on a 14-14 party-line vote on the nomination. The opposition to Becerra's nomination makes him the first of President Biden's Cabinet nominees not to be favorably reported out of committee. At this time, it is still likely that Becerra will be confirmed as early as this week given the urgency of staffing up the Department during the pandemic.

## CHCs Waiting on HRSA Administrative Dispute Resolution Process for Relief from Contract Pharmacy Restrictions

As previously reported, all three lawsuits brought by 340B providers regarding drug makers' refusal to ship 340B drugs to contract pharmacies have led to the same outcome: the courts will not get involved until a decision is reached via HRSA Administrative Dispute Resolution (ADR) process. Several organizations – including NACHC – filed claims under the ADR process in January, when the process was first made available, but to date HRSA has not taken any public action on these claims. A critical first step would be for the members of the ADR panel (akin to judges) to be appointed. President Trump appointed ADR panel members on the day before he left office, but the announcement was rolled back as part of President Biden's regulatory freeze.

### MaineCare Announces Johnson & Johnson Vaccine Codes and Rate

On March 5<sup>th</sup>, MaineCare announced the codes and rate for the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. Procedure code for the vaccine is 91303 with an SL modifier. The procedure code for the administration is 0031A and the reimbursement is \$26.21.

## CHCNET UPDATE

### **ImmPact COVID-19 Reporting**

For CHCs interested in improving their connection to ImmPact, Maine's Immunization Information System (IIS), please follow these steps:

1. Complete the [Onboarding Readiness Checklist and submit the Data Exchange Onboard Application](#).
  - a. Be sure to specify whether you're seeking flat-file upload capability or full HL7 integration (for real-time EHR-to-ImmPact reporting) and reiterate whether or not you'd prefer to involve HealthInfoNet in the process and leverage your HIE connection.
  - b. Once you email the form, ImmPact will begin processing the application and eventually follow up to coordinate the connection(s) necessary between the IIS and CHC (including EHR vendor and HIE, if applicable).
2. While ImmPact is processing your application:
  - a. Review the [Flat File Transfer Specification Document](#),
  - b. Build a report/reporting template according to the specifications and requirements therein, and
  - c. Contact your EHR vendor to notify and prepare of them of upcoming connections to the IIS. Your vendor may have specific steps to follow that will facilitate the connection.

**ImmPact is also offering multiple trainings each week to ensure users are have the necessary knowledge and skills to meet reporting expectations.** These meetings should be shared widely with all applicable staff.
