TELEHEALTH UPDATE

FCC to Provide Consumer Support for COVID-19 Telehealth Access

Last week, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) announced the Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) Program to increase consumer access to on-line services and resources during the current pandemic. The EBB program will provide \$3.2 billion in consumer subsidies to purchase discounted internet services and devices to connect with virtual health care, jobs, and education, which will help overcome barriers to accessing telehealth and technology.

The application window begins in late April 2020, and will be available on a first come, first served basis. **HRSA is encouraging health centers to begin preparing patients now to ensure broad access to the support.** Additional information, including how to become a program Outreach Partner, is available at [FCC's EBB webpage](#).

White House “Invites” CHCs to Expand COVID Vaccine Eligibility to all Frontline Essential Workers and all Persons Age 16 and Over with High-risk Conditions

As part of its [announcement](#) on Thursday morning about the \$6 billion in ARPA funding to CHC grantees, the White House also stated that:

“Community Health Centers participating in the federal Health Center COVID-19 Vaccine Program are invited to expand eligibility to populations in the ACIP’s 1C eligibility tier – this includes frontline essential workers and all persons 16 years and older with high-risk medical conditions. This means approximately 83% of the adults seen at Community Health Centers participating in the federal Health Center COVID-19 Vaccine Program will now be eligible for vaccinations.”

It is unclear how this invitation will impact CHCs in states that have not yet expanded vaccine eligibility this broadly.

Senate Passes Extension to the PPP Deadline; Bill to be Sent to the President’s Desk

Applications for the PPP are expected to be extended until May 31, 2021. The Senate voted on [March 25, 2021](#) by a 92-7 margin to extend the deadline. The bill will now be sent to the President’s desk where it is expected to be signed. Additionally, the SBA will have an extra 30 days after the deadline to process applications. CHCs are currently eligible for [First Draw PPP Loans](#) if they have 500 or more employees, but fewer than 500 employees per location. Existing PPP borrowers that did not receive loan forgiveness by December 27, 2020, can reapply for a loan if they previously returned some or all of their loan funds or request to modify their First Draw PPP loan amount if they previously did not accept the full amount for which they were eligible. [Second Draw PPP Loans](#) are only available to entities that received a First Draw PPP loan and will or have used the full amount for authorized uses, have no more than 300 employees per location, and can demonstrate at least a 25% reduction in gross receipts between comparable quarters in 2019 and 2020.

LIFT America Act Introduced by the Energy and Commerce Committee Democrats

The Leading Infrastructure for Tomorrow’s America Act, or [LIFT America Act](#), was introduced by Democratic members of the House Energy and Commerce Committee. In addition to modernizing the nation’s infrastructure, combating climate change, and investing in public health, the \$312 billion package includes \$10 billion in funding for CHC capital project grants – part of a \$30 billion investment in health infrastructure – and \$80 billion for the deployment of secure and resilient high-speed broadband.
