## PATIENT-CENTERED BOARD LEADERSHIP

**Did You Know?** Community Health Centers are governed by volunteer boards of directors committed to serving their communities and working to ensure the financial and operational success of health centers. CHC boards are unique among nonprofit organizations because federal law requires 51% of board members to be patients of the health center. This ensures that the board is reflective of the patient population that the CHC serves, which helps the health center be responsive to patient and community needs.



### READING CORNER

Advocates for Community Health released a special report on how CHCs utilize 340B savings. The 340B Drug Pricing Program allows CHCs, which have limited flexible funding streams at their disposal, to use their 340B savings for services that are non-reimbursable. As ACH reports, "the financial impact of these savings cannot be overstated, as they allow FQHCs to stretch their already scarce federal resources as far as possible, enhancing their services and expanding their reach in often overlooked communities."

# **CHCs IN THE NEWS**

### Penobscot Community Health Care

PCHC has announced that Preble Street will take over operations of the Hope House, a lowbarrier shelter in Bangor. Operations will officially shift to the non-profit in February.

A News Center Maine <u>report</u> on school-based health centers highlighted the clinics that PCHC operates in the Bangor and Brewer school districts and RSU 34, allowing students to access care quickly, without leaving school.

### **Greater Portland Health**

The same News Center Maine <u>report</u> also featured the work that GPH is doing to provide care to students in the South Portland Middle School. Students are able to receive sports physicals, immunizations, dental exams, and mental health care.

Earlier this fall, GPH participated in the first Oral Health Equity Conference sponsored by Cross Cultural Community Services.

In our last issue we shared GPH's participation in the AHEC Network Case Competition as a judge. The event took place in November and 49 participating AHEC Scholars to create care plans for a case study focused on maternal and child health for an asylum-seeking mother.

### **Fish River Rural Health**

FRRH <u>participated in a job fair</u> hosted by the St. John Valley Chamber of Commerce and CEO Heather Pelletier was on site to meet with potential new employees. Earlier this year, the health center celebrated construction of a \$14 million health care facility in the Madawaska Midtown Plaza. The project is set for completion in late 2025.

### **Pines Health Services**

Dr. John Gluscic has joined the Orthopedics and Sports Medicine team at Pines. They are welcoming new patients and procedures will include, but are not limited to, ACL repair, arthroscopies, carpal tunnel release, knee and hip replacements, rotator cuff repair, nerve decompression and sports medicine.

Pines <u>recognized</u> the Annual Great American Smokeout by providing free nicotine replacement therapy kits and resources.

In honor of Veteran's Day, Pines and Cary Medical Center sponsored a showing of the documentary film "The Unknowns" for the community.

### Maine Mobile Health Program

MMHP has been <u>awarded a grant</u> from the Maine Cancer Foundation to support essential cancer screening services for Maine's farmworkers—who are disproportionately affected by cancer compared to the general population.

CEO Amelia Lyons Rukema was quoted in the Bangor Daily News article about the connection between immigration and the fruits and vegetables on our tables. "Without farmworkers there is no food," she said. "Unless you live off the grid and harvest all your food, we are all reliant on farmworkers around the country."

MMHP has announced a number of new Board Members: <u>Milagros "Millie" Sanchez</u>, healthcare, psychology, and community engagement leader Chris Marine, Founder & CEO of Campfire Consulting, and <u>Chloe Manchester</u>, Infectious Disease Epidemiologist.
